University of Houston Downtown Teacher Quality Leadership Project



The UHD-TQ Project for middle school mathematics teachers has received funding for an additional year beginning Summer 2013 and extending through the following academic year to April 2014 to recruit additional participants to join our existing cohort. Applicants must be full-time classroom teachers-of-record and teaching Grades 6, 7, or 8 mathematics.

Participants will benefit from fully paid instruction and support as follows.

During the summer:

- One 3-hour graduate credit (MATH 6304) in mathematics topics relevant for middle grades mathematics content and pedagogy offered at UHD for two weeks in July after July 4, 9am 1 pm.
- Collaborative interaction with campus and grade-level peers to develop resources for use in the classroom
- Training in how to use an I-Pad in the classroom together with a loaner I-Pad and appropriate classroom applications for the duration of the program
- Interaction with campus and grade-level peers to develop collaborative lessons for use in the classroom

During the academic year:

- One 3-hour graduate credit (MAT 6316) in education as activities learned during the summer are applied in teachers' classrooms throughout the year
- One 3-hour graduate credit (MATH 6318) in mathematics
- Attend 12 evening sessions at UHD or synchronously online to further develop middle school mathematics content
- Support from UHD faculty in applying concepts and skills learned during the summer
- Continued interaction with summer cohort collaborative teams

The grant will pay for:

- UHD tuition and fees
- Reimbursement of \$35 fee for application to UHD as a post-baccalaureate student and for the required meningitis vaccine for those under 30 years of age through the UHD clinic
- Reimbursement for official transcripts required by UHD for this application
- Books, manipulatives related to coursework
- I-Pad on loan for the duration of the project. This will become the teacher's personal property upon completion of the entire program, or will be returned in working order to the project if unable to complete the entire program.
- Guest presenters
- Parking in the UHD visitors' lot
- Approximately \$600 stipend to help offset transportation/child care in order to attend the program that will be paid after the summer (\$350) and after the academic year (\$250) based on course completion of courses and attendance to scheduled course sessions.
